They were all well-illustrated, usually with hand coloured plates. This copy is in the standard decorative binding and has 20 hand coloured plates. It was one of the more popular of the series. The binding is in very good clean condition with bright gilt decoration to the front board and spine. Internally the front free endpaper is missing but remaining contents complete and clean. It was one of the more popular of the series - being reprinted by Routledge when they took over from Reeves. The binding is in very good clean condition with bright gilt decoration to the front board and spine. There is a little marking to the back board and a small bump to back corner. Internally there is some old repair to the front endpaper joint and a small edge tear to the half title page. P 165 has been badly opened with a section missing from the margin. Agnes Giberne. **Sun, Moon, and Stars. A Book for Beginners**. London: Seeley & co, 1888. 15th thousand. A typical Victorian book about the world around us for children. Victorians genrally saw nature as the 'Work of God' and it was a subject of reverence and wonder particularly in children's books. This work is typical in that it has 2 verses from the Bible on the title page and provides a basic introduction to the solar system while referencing prayer and Christian teaching. The binding has wear to edges, spine ends and corners and is very dulled at the edges and on the spine. There is some splitting at the endpaper joints and a signature from 1888 on the front endpaper. Back board with light marking. Internally there is a split at the front endpaper joint; rear joint is fine. Contents with occasional light foxing. Final 2 leaves have lost their bottom corners without loss of text. Stitching sound if slightly wobbly in the middle. Fair. Decorative cloth . (8183)

Andrew Lang. **The Pink Fairy Book**. London: Longmans, Green and Co., 1906. New impression. A good copy of the new impression with numerous black and white illustrations by H J Ford. In the original decorative cloth binding. The spine is faded and worn with a split at the top spine end, but the front board with beautiful gilt decoration is bright and clean. All page edges gilted. Inscription dated 1909 to front endpaper. Contents complete and generally very clean. Some browning to the endpapers and some foxing in places, particularly at the bottom margin. Colin Kerr was a master craftsman in wood, who worked on Eday and taught himself bookbinding. He loved books and he rebound it although it had sellotape repairs and 2 plates are missing. When he died it remained at his croft for a while and his new binding was nibbled by something - probably an insect in larval form. It is still a charming work but retains 6 of 8 plates and has some sellotape repairs at the beginning. Poor. Hardcover. (3139) £2.00

Andrew Lang (editor). **The Red Romance Book**. London: Longmans, Green and Co., 1905. 1st Edition. One of the Fairy Book series with 8 colour plates and numerous black and white illustrations by H J Ford. The decorative cloth binding has a cocked spine, with wear to spine ends and spine joints. Boards are reasonably bright with wear to corners and edges. The decorative endpapers are clean with an inscription to the verso of the fep. All page edges gilted.
